“Public Power Week is a chance for Alameda



Go Solar



Now is the time to join the solar revolution! Alameda Municipal Power (AMP) offers an attractive solar rebate program to encourage Alamedans to take advantage of the sun’s power. If your roof faces due south and has no or minimal shading, you may be interested in reducing your monthly electric bill by going solar. There is still funding in the program for additional residential and commercial installations!

The first step is to fill out and submit an application (available on our website: www.alamedamp.com). AMP recommends getting quotes for a solar system from at least three installers. We suggest checking references of potential solar contractors and consulting the

Help Your Budget with the Balanced Payment Program

Your life can be a bit easier by using AMP's Balanced Payment Program.

This convenient—and free—service makes budgeting easier for customers whose energy costs may vary from season to season. With the Balanced Payment Program, your bill will be predictable each month, winter or summer.

Under the Program, we calculate your average energy payment every 4 months by averaging the total payments out over the past 12 months. Rather than paying larger bills in the winter and smaller bills in the summer, your electricity bills will be consistent

throughout the year.

You may notice a small variation three times per year because of balance averaging.

Assistant General Manager—Customer Resources Sherri Hong says that the service is best for two types of customers. The first are those with electric heaters in their homes. Second are those on fixed incomes who may want to pay the same amount every month. “The typical residential bill goes up in the winter and down in summer,” Sherri explained. “For some, the difference can be from



a low of \$25 in the summer to \$45 during the winter. For others, particularly those with electric

heating, bills can go to \$100 in the winter and drop to \$30 in the summer.”

To enroll, you must have been at your current address for at least 12 months and your account must be current. To sign up, just call a Customer Service Representative at 748-3900.

Your Balanced Payment Program will begin with your next monthly bill.



“Got Incandescents?” Free CFLs at AMP Service Center

To help you save money, bring in three of your used incandescent light bulbs to Alameda Municipal Power's (AMP) Service Center (2000 Grand Street, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.) along with your latest electric bill, and we will give you three replacement compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) absolutely free! You save the cost of the bulb, and you save on your bill for years to come! (Limit three per Alameda household.)

Compact fluorescent light bulbs, or CFLs, are the better choice for lighting your home. Ordinary incandescent bulbs waste about 90 percent of their energy generating heat. They typically last for about 1,000 hours or about 8.5 months. CFLs use 75% less electricity and provide up to 10,000 hours or 7 years of light.

Better Business Bureau. Citizens should be aware that AMP does not endorse or have a partnership with any installer. If you decide to proceed with a solar installation, your contractor should submit a solar rebate application on your behalf.

The 2011 rebate level is \$2.25 per installed watt (AC, or alternating current). Since the inception of the solar rebate program in 2008, roughly 500 kilowatts of solar have been installed in Alameda, that collectively generate over 876,000 kilowatt-hours annually. In addition to the AMP rebate a Federal tax credit may be available—when rebates are combined your cost can be reduced by up to 50%! Take action now! Check the amount of funding left at the current rebate level or learn more about AMP's solar rebate program by visiting www.alamedamp.com.
