





AMP HELPS AEF POWER UP TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION

AN ISLAND WIDE ROBOTICS LEAGUE

The Alameda Education Foundation (AEF) plans to use money raised by the *Power Up For Learning* program this year to fund an island-wide Robotics League.

SIGN UP AND DONATE

The Power Up For Learning (PUFL) program allows residents to sign up to make a monthly donation through AMP on their electric bill. AMP then gives the donation to AEF, which in

turn uses the funds to support technology education in Alameda public schools.

SPANNING MULTIPLE GRADE LEVELS

The robotics program at Wood Middle School will be expanded into a district-wide league and will span multiple grade levels.

The funds from PUFL will be used to purchase robotics kits for Title I elementary schools and support the promotion of the league. Also, the

funds will help sponsor the Island City Robotics High School Team.

The Robotics League promotes Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM) in schools, as well as logical thinking, problem solving skills, and encourages creativity.

PREPARING FOR POWER OUTAGES: STORM WARNINGS



GODZILLA 2016!

Weather forecasts say a new El Niño, nicknamed Godzilla, could bring rampaging, chaotic storms this winter, storms which could on occasion cause power outages.

IF THE POWER IN YOUR HOME GOES OFF

- Check to see if there's a blown fuse or tripped circuit breaker at your service panel.
- If the power is still off, check to see if the outage includes other houses in your neighborhood.
- If the lights are off at other homes on your street, call AMP at 510-748-3902.
- For outage updates, check out AMP on Facebook and Twitter.

SAFETY TIPS DURING AN OUTAGE

- Keep flashlights, a battery-powered radio, and fresh batteries in an easily accessible place.
- Turn off major appliances and unplug electronics like TVs and computers.
- Leave one light on so you can tell when power is turned back on.
- Keep refrigerator and freezer doors closed. Most food in the fridge will last 24 hours except dairy products, which should be discarded after six hours.
