IT'S YOUR UTILITY

Public Power Week is the first full week in October each year, a time to recognize how Alameda's 132-year-old utility benefits the community.

AMP: OWNED BY YOU

Since 1887, Alameda has benefited from its locally owned and operated electric utility. Alameda Municipal Power is community-owned, which means that Alameda residents like you are owners of the utility.

LOWER RATES

As an owner, you benefit from lower rates. AMP does not make a profit from your electric rates, which average 17% below those of neighboring communities.

Unlike investor-owned utilities, your money doesn't

go to shareholders. It goes toward system operations and to improving public services through annual transfers of more than \$5 million to the city's general fund.

CELEBRATE ELECTRIC VEHICLES

This year, your 132-year-old utility will celebrate Public Power Week by reflecting your commitment to the environment. Since the community is focused on ways to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, AMP will be sponsoring a number of events to spread information on the benefits of owning electric vehicles.

ROUNDING UP EV REBATES AND INCENTIVES



NEW REBATE ON NISSAN LEAF

If you're thinking about purchasing an electric vehicle (EV) this month, AMP can help you save thousands of dollars. Until September 30, Alamedans are eligible for a rebate of \$3,500 on the 2019 Nissan LEAF 40 kWh Standard and of \$2,500 on the 2019 Nissan LEAF 62 kWh ePlus.

The rebate is available due to AMP's membership in the American Public Power Association (APPA), which partnered with Nissan to offer the incentive to public power communities.



FEDERAL AND STATE INCENTIVES

You can stack on federal and state incentives to lower the cost of EV ownership even more. You can get up to \$7,500 in federal tax credits for your electric vehicle purchase. Plus, California offers rebates of up to \$7,000 for buying electric vehicles.



AMP RATE DISCOUNTS AND REBATES

MONTHLY ELECTRIC BILL DISCOUNT

AMP offers a monthly discount on electric bills ranging from \$9 to \$21 to all customers who own electric vehicles.

AMP EV CHARGER REBATES

AMP also offers a rebate of \$800 toward the purchase of a level 2 charger and/or any installation upgrades and permitting needed to install the charger.

AMP also offers level 2 charger rebates for businesses, multifamily dwellings and public agencies.
