



TASTY COMMERCIAL KITCHEN REBATES

With the launch of AMP’s rebates for commercial food service appliances, you now have even more ways to save money when making the switch from gas to electric appliances. You reduce carbon emissions when you swap gas appliances for electric models because they run on Alameda’s 100% clean energy.

Hot Off the Griddle

Business customers can now get cash incentives for many kinds of energy-saving commercial food services appliances. Qualifying equipment includes:

Induction cooktops	Electric griddles
Induction ranges	Ice machines
Electric combination ovens	Solid-door refrigerators
Electric convection ovens	Solid-door freezers
Electric steam cookers	Glass-door refrigerators
Electric fryers	Glass-door freezers

Electrifying Rebates for Residents

Don’t forget: AMP residents also qualify for rebates on a variety of all-electric appliances. Get up to \$2,500 when you upgrade your electric panel to add appliances powered by 100% clean energy.

Power Up Your Electric Panel

To qualify for the rebate funds, the panel should be upgraded to 200 amps or up to an amount that can run the five major all-electric appliances: electric vehicle charging, electric dryer, electric water heating, electric space heating and electric stove.

You will need to show that you have installed, or are planning to install, at least two of these five appliances. You can also meet this requirement if you already have at least one of these appliances and you are installing a second one. The existing electric appliance in your home must be no older than September 21, 2020. Any non-existing appliances that are used to qualify for the electric panel rebate must replace non-electric appliances intended for the same purpose.

EV Chargers, Electric Dryers and More

PLUS, AMP offers cash rebates on several of these appliances, including up to \$800 on level 2 EV chargers, up to \$100 on electric dryers, and up to \$1,500 on heat pump water heaters.

Save More with Multiple Rebates

AMP’s rebates can be used in combination with rebates from the Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN). For example, you can combine AMP’s heat pump water heater rebate of up to \$1,500 with BayREN’s \$1,000 incentive toward the water heater’s purchase and installation.

LAST CHANCE FOR EXTRA CASH BACK OFFER ON EVs, CHARGERS

Don't delay: AMP's extra cash back promotion for driving green ends June 30. You can get up to \$2,300 cash back when you buy a used all-electric vehicle and install a level 2 charger at the same time.

Used All-Electric Vehicle + EV Charger


Buy a used battery electric vehicle and install a level 2 charger to qualify.

- Standard offer: Get up to \$2,300 cash back
- Income-eligible offer: Income-eligible customers can qualify for up to \$3,300 cash back.

Commercial EV Chargers and Electric Forklifts

Install a commercial level 2 EV charger or buy an electric forklift and you may qualify for up to \$6,000 in cash rebates.

- Commercial charger rebate-\$5,000 + \$1,000 bonus=\$6,000
- Commercial forklift rebate-\$2,000 + \$1,000 bonus=\$3,000



Did you know AMP's entire budget to run Alameda's electric system comes from rates?

As a community-owned utility, AMP uses the rates funds to operate the electric system and improve community services for Alamedans through transfers to the city.

For the second fiscal year in a row, the Public Utilities Board has decided not to raise rates for all customers. Comparing AMP's rates to PG&E's rates, AMP customers will save 26% on average, or \$22 million total, on their utility bills in fiscal year 2022.

COMING SOON! NEW RATE OPTION FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLE OWNERS

Early enrollment for the new time-of-use (TOU) rate plan for residential electric vehicle owners begins June 1! Customers who are eligible for the new TOU plan may benefit from having more control over their electric bills. The new rate option goes into effect July 1.

Pre-Enrollment Starts June 1

The application form for the plan will be available on www.alamedamp.com on June 1. Customers can pre-enroll for the plan in June, or they can enroll at any time starting July 1. The TOU plan is an opt-in program; customers will not be automatically placed on the new rate. The table below shows the plan's hours and rates:
