




AMP'S ONLINE MARKETPLACE OPENS SOON

Did you know that AMP offers a wide range of incentives and rebates for driving electric? In honor of Drive Electric Week 2021 (Sept. 25-Oct. 3), take a few minutes to explore AMP's electric vehicle offers.

Time-of-Use Rate for Electric Vehicle Owners

AMP's new time-of-use (TOU) program for electric vehicle owners launched July 1. Customers who are eligible for the TOU rate plan may benefit from lower pricing and have more control over their electric bills.

Used All-Electric Vehicle Rebate

Buy a used battery electric vehicle and you may be eligible for a cash rebate of up to \$1,500. This rebate only applies to used all-electric vehicles with a purchase price below \$22,000.

Standard AMP Rebates • Used battery electric vehicle \$1,000

Income-Qualified AMP Rebates • Used battery electric vehicle \$1,500

AMP Residential EV Charger Rebate

Purchase and install a level 2 (240V) electric vehicle charger at home and receive a rebate reward card worth up to \$800.

AMP Commercial EV Charger Rebate

Purchase and install a maximum of six, level 2 EV charging stations at your non-residential service address to become eligible for cash rebates. AMP's commercial EV charger rebate consists of \$5,000 for each level 2 charging station and \$500 per additional port.

AMP RELEASES REPORT ON 100% CLEAN ENERGY

Check out the table below to view the sources of Alameda’s 100% clean energy mix. AMP releases a report on the energy mix, known as a power content label, each fall for the prior calendar year. The report is required by the California Energy Commission.

In the report below, AMP’s power mix is shown as the standard in blue. Alameda Green, an AMP program, is shown in green. Alameda Green is Green-e® Energy certified and meets the environmental and consumer-protection standards set forth by the nonprofit Center for Resource Solutions. HOW YOUR UTILITY BENEFITS THE COMMUNITY

Public Power Week: October 3-9, 2021

Public Power Week falls on the first full week of October each year, a time to recognize how Alameda benefits from its 134-year-old electric utility. AMP is community-owned, which means that Alameda residents like you are owners of the utility.

Lower Rates

As an owner, you benefit from lower rates. AMP does not make a profit from your electric rates. Comparing AMP’s rates to PG&E’s rates, AMP customers will save 26% on average, or \$22 million total, on their utility bills in fiscal year 2022.

100% Clean Energy

You can also take pride in AMP’s 100% clean energy mix. In 2020, AMP began providing 100% clean energy to all customers, placing Alameda in a select group of cities leading the nation in the transition to green power. AMP has achieved this milestone decades ahead of California’s goal of 100% clean power by 2045.
