

The first week of October marked Public Power Week, a celebration that highlights the benefits of public power that 2,000 community-owned electric utilities across the United States provide.

AMP is proud to be Alameda's public power provider and partner for electrification, and for Public Power Week, AMP staff had the opportunity to connect and engage with the community in several impactful ways. In addition to a new rebate incentive, energy program, and an EV expo, AMP partnered with local organizations to give back. Here are the highlights:

- We raised \$1,845 for Building Futures' Alameda Women's and Children's Shelter, which totals more than FIVE move-in kits for families in need
- Collectively, staff volunteered nearly 100 hours of their time with the Alameda Food Bank
- Members of AMP's line crew came out to the Alameda Boys & Girls Club and spoke with about 40 youth about power safety and demonstrated some of the tools they use to keep the city's power on

We are community powered and community engaged. AMP thanks Alameda residents for celebrating Public Power Week alongside us.

Stay Warm and Save Energy this Winter

It's sweater weather!

In addition to cozying up in your favorite knitwear, here are some energy-saving ways to keep yourself warm and your home comfortable as the weather gets colder:



Keep heat inside: On sunny days, uncover windows to let in warmth, then close the drapes just before sunset. Install door sweeps between door bottoms and the floor to keep cold drafts out.



Make sure your heat systems are working optimally: Clean or replace dirty furnace filters. Move furnishings that may be covering heating grills.



Program your thermostat: Pre-set your thermostat temperatures for different times of the day. Better yet, consider installing a smart thermostat that will automatically adjust temperatures for optimal performance. (And don't forget to apply for your AMP smart thermostat rebate!)



Be space heater smart: Limit space heater use to small, closed off rooms. Look for a heater with a smart sensor that automatically shuts off the unit when it overheats or is tipped over.

Alameda Public Utilities Board Appoints New President and Welcomes New Member



Ryan Bird joins the PUB: At their regular meeting on September 18, 2023, the Public Utilities Board welcomed its newest member Ryan Bird. Commissioner Bird brings 12 years of experience in the clean energy sector, including the last ten at Energy Solutions working with utilities across the country to design and implement customer programs. He currently serves as an Associate Director at Energy Solutions, overseeing electric vehicle and demand management programs. He has a mechanical engineering degree from Duke University and prior to Energy Solutions worked on energy efficiency projects at the state level with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.



New PUB President Christina McKenna: The Public Utilities Board also appointed Commissioner McKenna to the role of PUB President, where she will serve a 2-year term. President McKenna previously served as PUB Vice President, and Commissioner Hunter now assumes that role. Commissioner Serventi will continue to serve on the Board in a non-officer role.

WHERE YOUR 100% CLEAN ENERGY COMES FROM: AMP's 2022 Power Content Label

AMP has been providing 100% Clean Power to Alameda since 2020 at costs 35% lower than PG&E's electricity. Alameda's clean energy comes from a mix that includes geothermal, hydroelectric, wind, and landfill recovery.

Each year, AMP releases a chart indicating its sources of energy as required by the California Energy Commission, known as a Power Content Label. Check out Alameda's 2022 clean energy mix compared to the state average.
