## **CITY OF ALAMEDA:**

Founded in 1853, the City of Alameda is an island community located in the heart of the San Francisco Bay, just west of Oakland and east of San Francisco. The city has a population of 78,338 and comprises 22.8 square miles.

## **ALAMEDA MUNICIPAL POWER:**

Alameda Municipal Power (AMP) was founded in 1887 and is the oldest municipal electric utility in California and is among the oldest in the nation, public or private. AMP is governed by an independent Public Utilities Board that was created in 1930 to ensure that the utility would remain under local control and generate a return to the community.

## **AMP'S MISSION:**

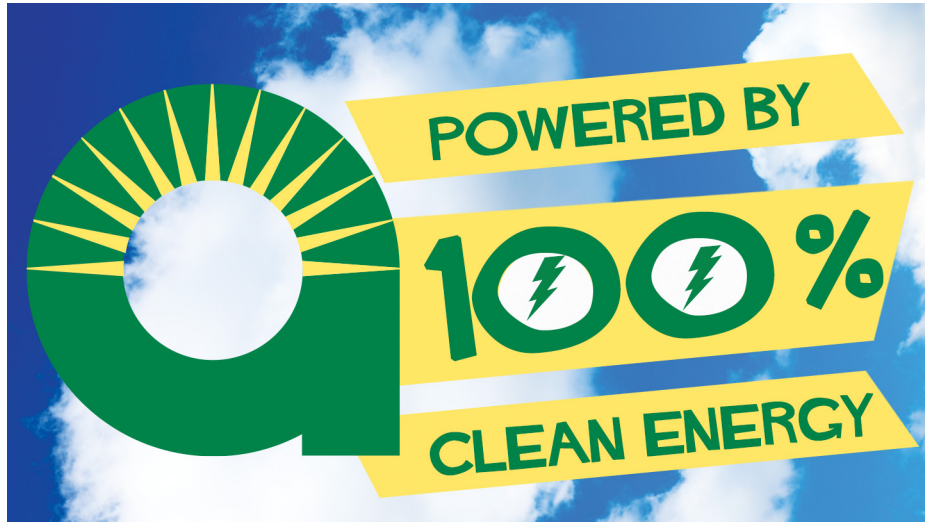
To increase value to Alameda by providing safe, reliable, cost-effective and environmentally responsible electricity.

## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Comparing AMP's rates to PG&E's, AMP customers will save about 20%, or \$15.5 million, on their utility bills in fiscal year (FY) 2021.
- AMP provides clean power at a rate 17% below East Bay Community Energy's (EBCE) rate for the comparable 100% clean power mix.
